Overview of FUP and FYI

HUD'S FOSTER YOUTH TO INDEPENDENCE (FYI) INITIATIVE EMERGED FROM THE FSHO COALITION

- The Fostering Stable Housing Opportunities (FSHO) Coalition, led by ACTION Ohio, includes more than 55,000 foster care alumni and allies.
- The Coalition works in partnership with the National Center for Housing & Child Welfare, foster youth champions on the Hill such as Reps. Turner and Bass, and Dr. Ben Carson and his team at HUD to synchronize existing federal programs to eliminate the gaps through which foster youth fall into homelessness.
- FSHO capitalizes on the best services that child welfare and housing agencies have to offer – as well as the industriousness of the youth themselves.





HUD'S COMMITMENT TO YOUTH IS INTENSE

Adaora Onuora

- Child welfare staff must be aware of a range of housing options as they conduct transition planning meetings with youth.
- Working in partnership with PHA staff, child welfare staff can help youth access housing and self-sufficiency programs.
- Adaora is in the homeownership program as well!
- FYI matters because the window to access FUP can be brief and unpredictable.

Each partners' role will can and should be sorted out in the MOU or letter of agreement. Even though youth aren't listed in these documents – remember that they have the most responsibility here and should be encouraged to lead.

Keep in mind that planning for successful transition to adulthood is required by federal law

 The Fostering Connections to Success and Increasing Adoptions Act of 2008 (P.L. 110-351) (FCSA) requires CW to create a youth directed plan 90 days prior to discharge.

This plan MUST include housing.

What is "Section 8" and how do I find it?

What is "Section 8"

- The housing choice voucher program is the federal government's major program for assisting very low-income families, the elderly, and the disabled to afford decent, safe, and sanitary housing in the private market.
- A housing subsidy is paid to the landlord directly by the PHA on behalf of the participating family. The family then pays the difference between the actual rent charged by the landlord and the amount subsidized by the program. Under certain circumstances, if authorized by the PHA, a family may use its voucher to purchase a modest home.
- The PHA calculates the maximum amount of housing assistance allowable. The maximum housing assistance is generally the lesser of the payment standard minus 30% of the family's monthly adjusted income or the gross rent for the unit minus 30% of monthly adjusted income. Therefore, generally a household will pay 30% of their income and the PHA pays the rest.

How does the money exchange hands?

Everyone -- tenant, landlord and PHA -- has obligations and responsibilities under the voucher program.

- HUD and the PHA agree to an "annual contributions contract" based on the perunit cost in a neighborhood – and HUD dispenses the federal funds to the PHA
- The housing unit selected by the family must meet an acceptable level of health and safety before the PHA can approve the unit. If so, the landlord and the PHA sign a housing assistance payments (HAP) contract that runs for the same term as the lease.
- The tenant (voucher holder) and the landlord sign a year long lease. The tenant pays their "Total Tenant Payment" directly to the landlord.

Where are the vouchers and the PHAs?

- HUD has offers tools to help the general public locate PHAs and understand the number and type of vouchers available
- Visit the <u>Housing Choice Voucher Dashboard</u> to view vouchers at all PHAs (except "Moving to Work" agencies).






This shows the service area for the MD Dept. of Housing and Community Development.





Build and nurture the relationship – provide cross-trainings




PCWAs can and should use tools for forecasting the youth who will need vouchers and when. This will be covered at length






PHA Waiting List

When you click on this statement, a drop-down box of all the housing authorities that have ever had a Family Unification Program will appear. Choose the desired housing authority. Most housing authorities listed are not currently accepting referrals. Email the <u>DCFS FUP Liaison</u> for information of the housing authorities currently accepting referrals for FUP. You will find the email address in your Outlook Directory while in your Illinois gov email.

Head of Household Information

List only one adult (the person you think should have control of the voucher) and provide requested information, including their social security number. The head of household must read the statement above their signature and sign their name below the statement.

Other Adults in the Household

List only the adults who will move with the head of household to the new unit and provide requested information. All *other* adults must read the statement above the head of household's signature and sign their name in the appropriate spot. Include their information (including their social security number). If there are more than two other adults who will live with the head of household, complete a second copy of the first page with the appropriate housing authority's name listed at the top of the page.

Address

- 1. If they are homeless, list the address they stayed last night.
- 2. If their mailing address is different than their address, list their mailing address as well.







- NCHCW, with support from Casey Family Programs is assembling all of our tools in the form of an Ebook to be distributed widely in mid-November.


